

Confetti Live

Throughout the year, we put on a series of gigs to give our students the chance to perform at some of Nottingham's top venues, including The Bodega, Rough Trade and our very own Metronome. Our live & technical events students run the shows, and we invite the general public along to watch.

Splendour

Every year our students work alongside events promoters DHP and professional crews to help put on Nottingham's largest outdoor music festival – Splendour. Events students control the behind-thescenes technology, PA and lighting; music performance students observe and some even get to perform; while the film & TV students work with Notts TV to film and record all the action backstage.

Hockley Hustle

The Hockley Hustle music festival fills the streets and venues of Hockley with some of the best up-and-coming and established talent in Nottingham. Confetti regularly hosts a stage at the event, featuring our students past and present. There are lots of ways for you to get involved with Hockley Hustle, whether you're performing, running the show as part of the tech crew, or volunteering to help at the venues.

Lockwood Publishing

Our games students have gained some valuable Do It For Real work experience working alongside employees at the highly successful online publishing studio Lockwood, who specialise in social games and created the popular virtual world app Avakin Life.

We offer college courses at three different levels: Level 1, Level 2 and Level 3. You'll need certain GCSE grades, and Maths and English skills to be accepted onto some of our courses.

If you have not yet achieved grade 9 – 4 (A*-C), you will study Maths and/or English at Confetti as part of your course.

BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma (equivalent to 3 A Levels)

You'll need

5 GCSEs grade 9-4 (A*-C) including English and Maths

An appreciation of, and a passion for, the subject you're applying for, with a level of practical experience and/or a Level 2 qualification in the subject area.

CORE SKILLS

As part of your programme of study, you'll have a Personal and Professional Development session. Also, depending on your prior English and Maths attainment, you may need to improve your grade as part of your course.

Professional and Personal Development

As a Confetti student you will take part in our Professional and Personal Development (PPD) programme, which will support you to develop your knowledge and skills beyond the academic, technical and vocational areas.

These sessions are on your timetable and part of your vocational course, for an hour per week. As part of your programme of study, you'll examine a range of development themes set out by Ofsted, tailored with our own experience, knowledge and understanding of our students.

Overall we aim to develop your ability to think independently and create an open and non-judgemental platform to put forward your views, ideas and opinions.

English and Maths

If you haven't yet achieved a Grade 9-4 (A*-C) for Level 3, and Grade 9-3 (A*-D) for Level 2, you'll study Maths and English at Confetti as part of your course. You'll attend a compulsory GCSE or Functional Skills session over the course of a year, which is a requirement for all of our vocational courses at Confetti.

Supporting you

If you haven't excelled at English or Maths at school before, don't worry. We have an excellent pass rate in both English and Maths, and surpass the national benchmark. We pride ourselves on our ability to make the subjects interesting, coaching you through the

syllabus in a way that works for you. Our aim is to help you to achieve a grade 4 (C) or above in both subject areas, to aid you in your progression to higher education and employment.

Our syllabus

We follow the AQA syllabus for GCSE English and Edexcel for Functional Skills English. We use Pearson for both GCSE and Functional Skills Maths.

What will I study?

QOE	Pathway
GCSE Grades 9-4	No requirement for further study.
GCSE Grade 3	All students must study a GCSE in the relevant subject area.
GCSE Grade 2	This grade will be split in two by obtaining the raw marks for each awarding body the majority of which will be AQA / Pearson.
GCSE Grade 1	The majority of learners achieving a grade 1 will be registered on Entry Level 3. The mock test in week 2 may demonstrate the student is more capable in which case the teaching team will make a professional judgement based on evidence within the sessions.
Functional Skills Level 1	No requirement for further study.
Functional Skills Level 2	Learners joining us with a pass in Functional Skills Level 1 will the registered on the Functional Skills Level 2 course.
Functional Skills Level 3	Learners joining us with a pass in Functional Skills Entry Level 3 will be registered on the Functional Skills Level 1 course.
No approved qualification level	Ability will be determined through Initial Assessment during enrolment and the mock test during week 2.

Additional Learning Support (ALS)

Our ALS team will assess the support requirements of all students who declare a support need. If you feel that you require support you will be guided through our support assessment process.

Support is intended to enable access to learning for all students, whilst increasing a student's ability to work independently. We recognise that students are individuals, so how support is delivered will be different for everyone and can range from simple drop in sessions, through to individualised support

16 - 18 years old

No! Your college course is fully funded and you won't need to pay to study with us.

19 + years old

Yes, you may have to pay fees to cover the cost of your course. You'll be assessed each year, and the amount you'll pay may change with each assessment.

In 2019–2020, the fees were £1,000 per year. Fees change each year, so these are supplied as a guide only.

How to pay your fees (if applicable)

We know that paying everything up front sounds a bit daunting, so we've made paying your fees as easy as possible.

Choose to pay by either:

- In full, at enrolment (at the start of your first term, in the autumn)
- Sign a direct debit agreement which allows you to break your fees down into four, more manageable payments. There's no administration fee for this facility. The first payment must be paid at your enrolment session.
















GETTING HERE

Confetti's Campus is located in the heart of Nottingham's Creative Quarter and is easy to get to with great transport links.

Car

Nottingham is in the East Midlands and is easily reached by motorway. If you're coming from the north, south or west, use the M1 motorway, exiting at Junction 26 to reach the city. From the east, you can take the A52 into the city centre.

There are a limited number of pay-and-display parking spaces on King Edward Street, Brook Street and Bath Street. Car parks are also near Confetti's main Convent Street site, and music and events hub, Metronome on Brook Street, Huntingdon Street and Glasshouse Street (Victoria Centre).

Our film and TV hub, Space2, has parking facilities on Handel Street and Garnet Court – just a 3 minute walk away. You can pay for Nottingham on-street parking using cash, debit/credit cards and the Ringo app.

Coach

National Express coach services operate from Station Street, which is a 15 – 20 minute walk from our campus. If you're travelling from Derby, the Red Arrow runs every 10 minutes, non-stop down the A52.

Rail

Nottingham Rail Station is a 15 – 20 minute walk from our campus. You can take the East Midlands Train service if you're travelling from Beeston, Alfreton or Derby.

Tram

The NET tram runs between the rail station and many local areas, including Bulwell, Hucknall, Clifton and Radford. Our closest stop is a five minute walk away, in the Lace Market.

Bus

Thanks to our prime location in the city centre, there are bus routes connecting us to the surrounding areas. Many of these arrive outside intu Victoria Centre, which is a short walk from our campus.


